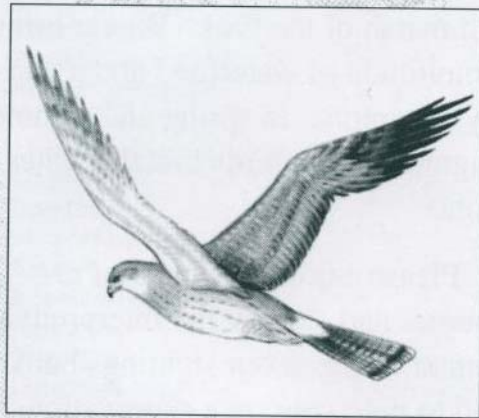

In many ways Liberty State Park offers some of the best birding in the State. With both estuarine and upland habitats, the Park's bird list currently numbers 239 species. During the summer months, the herons nesting in the Arthur Kill regularly feed in the salt marsh of the Park. Winter brings a multitude of waterfowl and a variety of raptors. In spring and summer, migrating shorebirds line the waterfront.

Please enjoy these natural resources and stop by the Interpretive Center to check our sightings book and to note your own observations.
